## SCC in a Nutshell



### THE ORGANIZATION IDENTITY

SCC is a dynamic, Cambodian faith-based organization that has played a major role in the fight against HIV/AIDS. Through the Loving-kindness, Compassion, Sympathetic Joy, Equanimity, commitment and dedication of a team of Buddhist monks, nuns, staff, volunteers and generous supporters, SCC has been able to improve the lives of many people infected with and affected by HIV/AIDS, particularly the poorest and least fortunate families, especially children, either orphaned or adversely affected by HIV/AIDS.

### VISION

A Cambodian Society where, all Cambodian people live with good health, freedom, dignity and prosperity.

### MISSION

SCC commits to develop capacity and sustainable community mechanisms through faith-based networks and other stakeholders to reduce vulnerability, and to prosper livelihood, health and children's rights to education.

### GOAL

SCC will have a significant contribution to achieve the national strategic plan by intensifying vulnerable families' and children's equitable accesses to health service and education.

### VALUES

SCC is guided in all its actions and by its core values, which are solidarity, spirituality, compassion, human rights, good governance, and democracy and rule of law.

# 1. CBE SCHOOL BACKGROUND

**Children’s Basic Education (CBE)** School is one of SCC’s projects which is located in Veal Village, Kok Chork Commune, Siem Reap District, Siem Reap Province, Cambodia. It is around 1km west of Angkor Wat Temple, approximately 3km from Siem Reap International Airport and across from the big white Angkor Hot Air Balloon.

**CBE School** was founded in 2010 by **Mr. Prum Thoeun** and **Christine** and **Doug Frewer**, a generous Australian couple. During Christine and Doug’s had the first trip to Cambodia, and they were introduced to SCC by Timothy, their son who had been working in Cambodia and Lao of his first research.

The name of the school was changed from “CBE Angkor” to “CBE Christine” after SCC management discussion. Why is it called CBE Christine? It was because of SCC aimed at dedicating this name to **Christine** who passed away from breast cancer in 2014. Doug Frewer has also done significant job in introducing and fundraising for SCC and the school in Australia, where the school goes by the name **CBE-Bush School**.

# 2. SCHOOL MANAGEMENT ( LAST PERIOD DATA)

## 2.1. School Structure

SCC-CBE Christine staff is made up of 8 committed staff members (4 males and 4 females) working together to provide the best education and support to the students. Below is a breakdown of the roles and responsibilities of each of our staff members.

## 2.2. Study Programs

The students are taught 6 different subjects during their classes: **English, Math, Art, Physical Education, Science and Music**. The subjects are split between each day of the week with additional sport activities also provided to the children.

School has **two sessions**: one in the morning and another in the afternoon, 5 days per week. The morning session starts at **8am to 10am** and the afternoon session starts at **2pm to 4pm**. There are approximately 15 to 20-minute break times depending on meal preparation.

### 3. STUDENT MANAGEMENT ( LAST PERIOD DATA)

#### 3.1. Number of classes and students: Moved, New student, and Upgrade

SCC CBE-Christine is currently running five different courses with a total of **110 students**. The classes are split between age groups and state school grades. Below is a breakdown of the teachers, classes and students.

## 4.2 Collaborations

In August 2020, we had cooperation with TDH Organization which is similarly working out with Children Protection from tourists, people, and many kinds of social media. They selected our 3 youth from SCC-CBE Christine to work with them.

On 6<sup>th</sup> August 2020, we had a students and parents meeting at CBE-Christine School which was held about 2 hours and conducted by TDH. The purposes of TDH were

- Introduced about their own NGO to NGO partners
- Child Protection from Tourists and other people
- Self defense
- Cheating signification
- Group study 2 times per month. Each time has only 8 kids.

There were 20 people including authority related to participated

1. Kok Chork Commune Leader.
2. Veal Village Leader
3. Parents and kids
4. CBE and TDH staffs



### 4.3 Conducted Home Visit to the Students

After we had a meeting and a long discussion with SCC Director and BMT, They decided not to open the school yet. We wait until everything safe and to be sure that COVID 19 is not spread up around or waiting the appropriate time they are going to inform the staff later. But during the state schools open, SCC suggested CBE Staffs to check and push the kids to be at state schools on time by following up few criteria below:

1. The poorest families
2. The poor families
3. The normal families

We spent time in the last two weeks to visit students and their parents at home with three team separated and focused on the criteria such as bellow:

Team 1: Visit to the poorest family and meeting 19 students including 7 girls.

Team 2: Visit to the poor in medium family and meeting 20 students including 12 girls.

Team 3: Visit to the normal condition family and meeting 30 students including 22 girls.

As a result of monitoring and encouraging the families of children who are students of SCC-CBE Christine School, we met 69 students, 28 boys and 41 girls.

*The rest families, we followed up by phone call, all of them are looking forward to sending their kids to SCC-CBE Christine School whenever we are ready to open.*



## 5. ABOUT VISITORS VISITED SCC-CBE CHRISTINE SCHOOL

During this quarter (July-August-September 2020), we didn't have any volunteers or visitors come to our school.

## 6. QUARTER IN REVIEW

### 6.1. Challenges & Issues

1. Land for planning vegetables isn't good at all.
2. Apsara is still a big challenging for any kinds of constructions.
3. Electricity is cut off quite often. We didn't get electricity directly from the public service. School was served by private one because we don't have land certificate and this case just only the land owner could help.
4. Yearly budget has changed from the next term. Supplementary food and meal will be decreased from February 2020.
5. 2020 is the last year that Firefly Mission supports SCC-CBE Christine School.
6. According to the world issue which was appeared and has affected to the whole life of people because of the COVID-19 pandemic, everything has changed. Among those issues the education in Cambodia has to shut down for a while. The state schools and NGOs had to be closed and would be opening again unless the governor approve and announce one day. We have to wait for the final announcement.

### 6.2. Solving Problem

1. Sewing class already set up.
2. Fans in the big class were already set up.
3. Safety gas already set up

### 6.3. Lesson Learn.

Due to the SERIOUS ISSUE happened in the world by COVID 19, we all get to know the public announcement or HEALTH SERVICE DEPARTMENT health protection is important for us and everyone. We all have to a real high protection, clean, good hygiene, get enough sleep, following up the news and do the best way to avoid or stop COVID 19 by:

- Not being at the crowds
- Clean hands with soap or alcohol regularly
- Limit people
- Any signs have to check with doctors
- Use masks... etc.

### 6.4. Next Plans

- Home visit to other students' family to make sure they are attending to the state school.
- Make SCC-CBE-Christine Team T-shirt
- Rearrange the English Class.
- Take pictures and make YouTube Channel for Doug and Petra for fundraising to the next year budget.
- Request 4-year budgets for other 3 University Students. (TEP NET / HENG CHENDA / PHOUEY SOPHY)

## 6.5. Case Study

**Mrs. Sokun** is from Pouk District it's about 13 km from SCC-CBE Christine School. She has started in our sewing class for 5 months already and she is willing to learn a new skill while she has nothing to do in the morning. She said "*I am glad to be here and learn in this class because I can learn a new skills for myself and I am be able to design some kids clothes and adults*". Now Mrs. Sokun could earn some money after she cut and sewed clothes for kids and people in her villages. She is smart and super curious lady.
