1. CBE SCHOOL BACKGROUND

Children’s Basic Education (CBE) School is one of SCC’s projects which is located in Veal Village, Kok Chork Commune, Siem Reap District, Siem Reap Province, Cambodia. It is around 1km west of Angkor Wat Temple, approximately 3km from Siem Reap International Airport and across from the big white Angkor Hot Air Balloon.

CBE School was founded in 2010 by **Mr. Prum Thoeun** and **Christine** and **Doug Frewer**, a generous Australian couple. During Christine and Doug’s had the first trip to Cambodia, and they were introduced to SCC by Timothy, their son who had been working in Cambodia and Lao of his first research.

The name of the school was changed from “CBE Angkor” to “CBE Christine” after SCC management discussion. Why is it called CBE Christine? It was because of SCC aimed at dedicating this name to **Christine** who passed away from breast cancer in 2014. Doug Frewer has also done significant job in introducing and fundraising for SCC and the school in Australia, where the school goes by the name **CBE-Bush School**.

2. SCHOOL MANAGEMENT

2.1. School Structure

SCC-CBE Christine staff is made up of 8 committed staff members (4 males and 4 females) working together to provide the best education and support to the students. Below is a breakdown of the roles and responsibilities of each of our staff members.

2.2. Study Programs

SCC CBE-Christine School is currently closed due to COVID-19 pandemic. The school will re-open on 18th January 2021 as a result of decision of the SCC Leaders’ meeting hold on 4th and 6th January 2021.

3. STUDENT MANAGEMENT

3.1. Number of classes and students: Moved, New student, and Upgrade

SCC CBE-Christine School is currently closed due to COVID-19 pandemic. When the school re-open, in that too we will update the number of student in our school.

4. OTHER SUPPORTING AND LEARNING ACTIVITIES

4.1. Computer Course

After the new Library was completed, we were able to move all the books from the Computer Lab. Previously, the Library and Computer Lab were in a combined space. The addition of the new Library allowed for a dedicated Computer Lab. The setup of this dedicated space would not have been possible without special donations from our visitors and volunteers. This additional class just creates to straighten new skill up for our kids. *Meng Hong* was our former student who used to learn English, Microsoft Word, Excel and Email mentioned that *"I'm now working at the International English School and use computer every day at my work. I think I'm a lot better than before. If I didn't learn hard at CBE, I probably couldn't have had a good job like this"*.

CBE School recently reopened computer class in November 2020. It was just only an hour a day. We opened and closed quite often because of virus exploded again and again in Cambodia. Otherwise we have to obey the governor's announcement and against the virus.

4.2. Sport Activities

SCC-CBE Christine also offers students additional support facilitates and coaching. The main sports include volleyball, football and tennis. Present time school is closing and some student stay at home getting stress, so they come to practice sport at ground for relaxation and to get healthy body.

4.3. Supplementary Food – Breakfast, Lunch & Drinking Water

We observed and considered that many students weren't getting enough food at home and may still be hungry when they arrive at school. We wanted to address this concern by seeking funding to support nutritious meals. Our donors Doug Frewer and Petra continue to work hard at raising funds to support these meals being provided regularly.

We have managed to raise enough funds to provide meals two days a week and fresh fruit on the other three days. We have also managed to provide clean drinking water to the children every day. As part of the CBE-Christine staff, we have a cook who provides different meals each week. For example: Chicken/pork/or fish porridge, Spicy Khmer Style Soup, Korkor Soup, Vegetable soup with meat and steamed rice, Stir fried food/Omelets, Fried fish, vegetables and sauce, Omelets with rice/ toast, and Noodles soup with vegetables and beef.

4.4. SCC-CBE Christine Scholarship Students

The first scholarship project started in 2015 with a female student, **Pok Kim San**, who is living in Banteay Chheu Village, Tuek Vil Commune, Siem Reap District, Siem Reap Province. Up to now we have got **10** different students who are learning at state school and are all past or current CBE-Christine students. Note: Choun Meng Hong and Pok Kim San were selected to continue at the University. **Kim San** is doing her English Literature Bachelor Degree at Pannasatra University for two years, but she moved to South-East Asia University because she changed her mind to study English Literature in Siem Reap. **Meng Hong** is also doing his Tourism Bachelor Degree at Build Bright University in Siem Reap in Year 2. We are so happy that both of them are working in town. Meng Hong works at the tour service and Kim San is working at T-Gallery as a seller and she is a volunteer teacher at TDH Organization.

Note: *For the other 8 students, their scholarship will support them until high school level only. If there are something changes, we will update later.*

4.5 Library Time

From time to time we open up the library for our students. In there they can read English and Khmer Books about different topics. So that they can improve their knowledge about literature, history, practice reading and enjoy their time.

5.3. Classified Sewing Class

This new course we focus on helping the ladies in our communities who have a great opportunity to learn for free in order to be straightened out their skill at cutting and designing clothes. This class was supported by **Micheal and Regina** the leaders of German Team who have been holding a project called “**Help Kids Cambodia**”. They helped for the first year already it was from January-June 2020. They are quite obsessed to continue for the second semester and it will continue for another semester from Jan-June 2021.

5.5. Students Home Visit

After we had a meeting and a long discussion with SCC Director and BMT They decided not to open the school yet. We wait until everything safe and to be sure that COVID-19 is not spread up around or waiting the appropriate time they are going to inform the staff later. But during the state schools open, SCC suggested CBE Staffs to check and push the kids to be at state schools on time by following up few criteria below:

1. The poorest families
2. The poor families
3. The normal families

We spent time in the last two weeks to visit students and their parents at home.

We got only 10 families.

The rest families we follow up by phone, all of them are looking forward to sending their kids to CBE School whenever we are ready to open.

5.6. Special Home Visit and Supports

⇒ **Accidental CBE Footballer**

On 04 November 2020, CBE Teachers and Mr. Tim Frewer went to visit Rem Sopheakra who had a motor accident and he checked up his health updating. He was much better when the doctor sent him out the hospital and he needed only to see something out to be sure that his memories got to turn back as normal again, but he needs more time to recover. Mr. Doug Frewer's friends sent \$200 for Sopheatra for any special needs.

⇒ **Breast Cancer lady**

On 05 November 2020, Mr. Tim Frewer and CBE Lead Teacher met **Mrs. Kdep Lpeak** in order to ask about her breast problem and really needed to cure her breast, but she had no money. In this time she had to feed three children by herself after got divorced with her husband. So Australian People from Christian Church supported \$100 for her. She didn't have an operation. She just decided to buy medicines for the first cure and now she is feeling much better.

Mr. Youk Het is a security guard at CBE-Christine. He has 6 children in his huge responsibility. He has been working for our school for almost 10 years since 2010. He has an income shortage. So Australian Friends also supported his family \$120. His wife and he said "Thanks very much for this supporting on a very hard time of COVID-19 that is spreading up around the world". They would keep this money for nutrition for their family.

7. QUARTER IN REVIEW

7.1. Challenges & Issues

1. Land for planning vegetables isn't good at all.
2. Apsara Authority is still a big challenging for any kinds of construction.
3. Electricity is cut off quite often. We didn't get electricity directly from the public service. School was served by private one because we don't have land certificate and this case just only the land owner could help.
4. Yearly budget will be changing from next term. Supplementary food and meal will be decreased from February 2020.
5. 2020 is the last year that Firefly supports CBE-Christine Project.
6. According to the world issue which was appeared and has affected to the whole life of people because of the COVID-19 everything has changed. Among those issues the education in Cambodia has to shut down for a while. The state schools and NGOs had to be closed and would be opening again unless the governor approves and announces one day. We have to wait for the final announcement.

7.2. Solving Problem

During this three months from **October – December** we don't have any problem to solve, because the school not running yet.

7.3. Lesson Learn

Due to the serious worldwide situation of COVID-19 SCC was invited to join the new course of Child Protection which was focused on the boy abuses at Angkor Children Hospital. CBE-Christine sent 3 teachers to learn for one day. It was really worth to get something news and it could be a good lesson as well for teachers and we would possibly delegate this lesson to our boys in community to learn and might protect the kids themselves from any abuses and be away from sex threatened all people around.

7.5. Case Study

Ladies in Community

On 04 December 2020 we had a group meeting of the ladies in our sewing class. That aim was just total the result of 3 set groups in this class.

- 1st group was actually had a very tough of young girls that gave up this class because of their study. It was hard to swap up times and they had to study extra class with Khmer Teachers.
- 2nd Team was disappeared because of Covid-19. The 1st semester isn't really easy at all. Even we tried to contact them. Later on, Mrs. Chan Savorn decided to choose the 3rd team for 2nd semester which was held from July-December 2020.
- 3rd team is going to finish their class in December 2020. After we met and discussed with beautiful team, they suggested us that they wanted to learn more. They obsessed with more designs and they also need some more sewing stuff because they haven't got enough stuff to practice. Clothes are the most needed.
- **Classes Provided**
For old students are still continued for another semester (Jan-June 2021), but it combined only class.
For new students will be in another class. But they all got to study only 2 hours per day. Finally, Mrs. Chan savorn asked more fund for this class already. Mr. Michael and Regina are approved to continue supporting us for another semester which will be starting in January-June 2021. The expense is surely \$1370.
